### **BAY AREA OLDER ADULTS** by Marianne Damon

ay Area Older Adults is a charitable 501(C)-3 organization "that helps older adults improve the quality of their lives". Their website lists a variety of activities available in the Bay Area, serving as a clearing-house for easy access to social, cultural and scientific events and outdoor activities. In addition to the ability of anyone to access this information on their website, they also have programs and events for members. Membership is open to adults aged 50 and older and includes a monthly newsletter listing all activities. Basic membership is free, and premium membership is \$25. Events include hikes and picnics, cultural events, the educational lecture series, day trips, and travel adventures. Some of these events are free to non-members and members alike (everyone just needs to register for the event). Some events have a nominal fee (for example, the upcoming Your Family Tree lecture is \$20 for non-members, \$15 for basic members, and \$10 for premium members). Day trips include transportation, an educational or cultural event, and lunch (an upcoming day trip is KQED & Culinary Tour of San Francisco).

I first learned about this organization when a friend e-mailed me with information she saw posted on Next Door for a lecture given by a NASA

program manager. I registered for the free lecture and learned that it was offered through Bay Area Older Adults. At the lecture I saw materials about various other lectures, outings and day-trips and was very impressed with the offerings. I spoke with the people there who were members, and all of them had positive experiences and good things to say about BAOA. I spoke with the founder of this organization, who has dedicated her efforts to the memory of her active, involved grandparents. I discussed what I had learned at our chapter board meeting, and we decided that this would be worthwhile information to share in our newsletter. While we do not endorse any specific group, we are aware that many of our members have been interested in day trips and cultural activities. Our Chapter, at this time, is not in a position to organize these types of events. However, this reputable organization just might be of interest to our members.
